# How Soon is Now?

A collection of works by 36 artists from the metropolitan area will be featured in The Bronx Museum's latest exhibition titled "How Soon is Now?". A number of local Latino artists will be featured in the show which runs through August 18.

The Latino artists featured are of international descent but currently reside in New York City, thus giving the show a local feeling with a global twist.

The participating Latino artists are: Blanka Amezkua (born in Mexico City, Mexico, and now in lives the Bronx); Margarida Correida (born in Lisbon, Portugal, and now lives in Brooklyn); Cosme Herrera (born in Tampa, Florida, lives in Brooklyn); Dulce Pinzon (born in Mexico City, Mexico, and now lives in Brooklyn); and Ronny Quevedo (Born in Guayaquil, Ecuador and now lives in the Bronx).

The name of the exhibition, "How Soon is Now?" is inspired by the title of the 1985 song by The Smiths. The show is a statement about the immediacy of being in the moment and is a remark on the state of the art world today.

All artists in the show participated in the recent program by The Bronx Museum, Artist in the Marketplace (AIM) a program for new and upcoming artists in the country. The program is in its 28th year with video and photography emerging as the main trend in this year's program. Although video and photography are the
